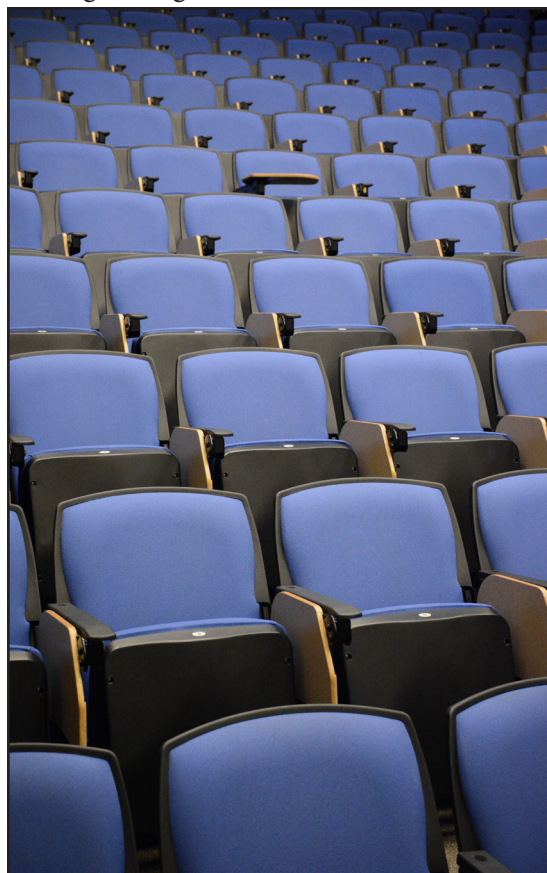

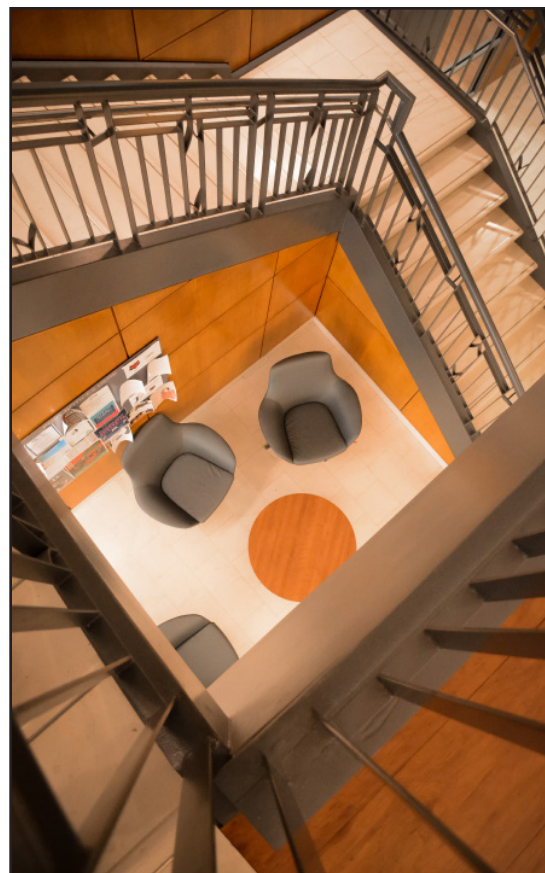
Art hangs in the hallways of the Fine Arts building, though no one is around to see the talented work.



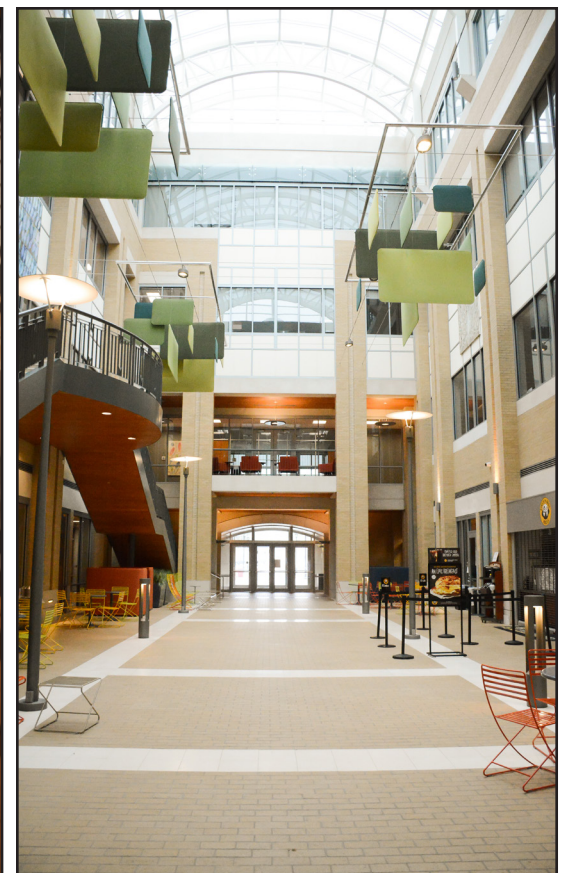
