## Movie theatre operates under COVID guidelines

During the pandemic, movie theatres were among the businesses affected by the initial shutdown and now by COVID-19 operational guidelines.

The Malco Jonesboro Towne Cinema is currently seating theatres with every-other-row empty, and encourages patrons to respect the space of others and social distance. The water fountains are also closed.

Consistent with other businesses open right now, there are plexiglass barriers at all of the registers. The concession stand is no longer doing refills in the same container,

but instead guests will instead be given a fresh container for their food or drink. Those going to see a movie are encouraged to purchase their tickets in advance, so the purchase of tickets will be as contactless as possible.

Face coverings are required at all times, unless the patron is eating or drinking.

There are behind-the-scenes sanitation guidelines as well, and the Malco's website shares what team members are doing to help keep theatre patrons safe, "All team members will be screened prior to each shift, including logged temperature checks. Employees will have to give a verbal disclosure that they are not sick, nor have they been

in close contact with anyone experiencing signs of sickness."

This is in addition to frequent handwashing, and the wearing of face coverings and gloves.

Between all shows, the auditoriums are being sanitized, high-contact surfaces such as countertops and handrails are being sanitized every 30 minutes and the restrooms are being sanitized every 30 minutes. In addition, all of the air filters in the air vents have been replaced with MERV-11 filters, which filter out a higher percentage of contaminants in the air.

With these protocols being followed, guests can enjoy a safe and fun experience seeing new films being released in theatres.
