

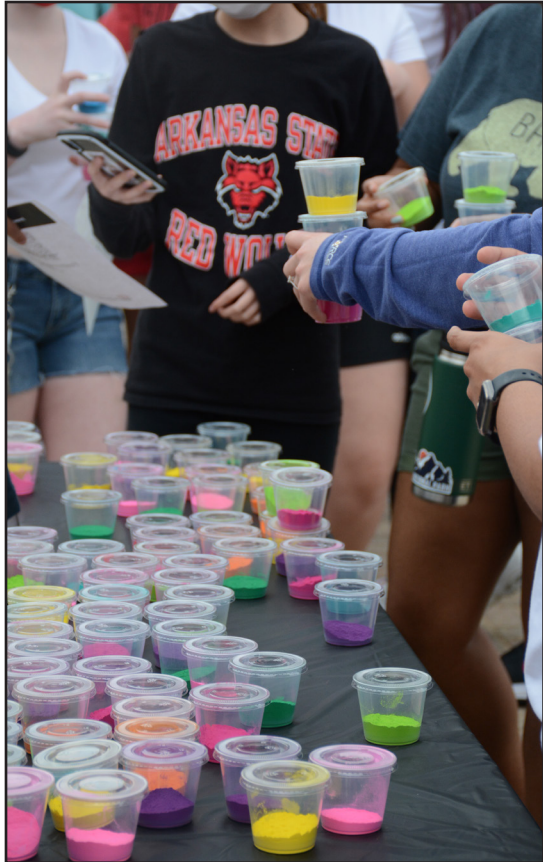
Students Get Colorful at the Holi "Festival of Spring"



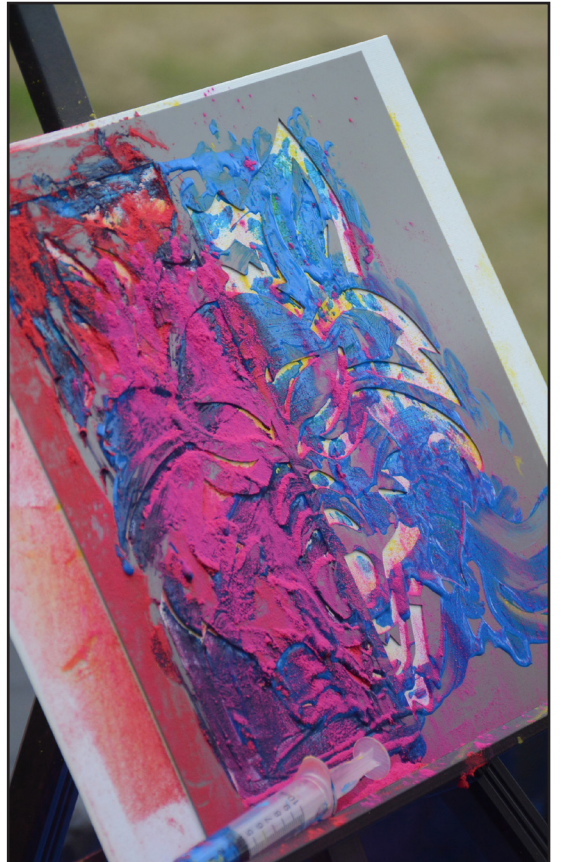
Students throwing vibrantly colored Holi powders onto blank canvases with stencils to make one-of-a-kind art pieces.
