

Men's Basketball three game winning streak

Arkansas State University's men's basketball team is on a three game winning streak after defeating ULM, UT Arlington and Texas State.

The men's team is currently 13-4 overall and 4-1 in Sun Belt Conference games. With the Red Wolves sitting at 13-4 a better record for 17 games record for the first time since 1988-89 and for only the fourth time in school history.

ULM game recap

The Red Wolves took on ULM in Monroe, Louisiana on Jan. 8.

The game ended in a final score of 90-83 despite being down 11 points with a little over 11 minutes left to play.

After securing the win Red Wolves were 11-4.

Both Norchad Omier and Caleb Fields earned double-doubles as well as scoring in double digits.

The top scorers for the Red

Wolves included Marquis Eaton with 25 points, Omier with 24 points, Fields with 17 points, and Desi Sills with 12 points.

UT Arlington Recap

At the game against UT Arlington on Jan. 20, the game ended in a close final score of 75-70.

Omier, Sills, Eaton and Fields were among the top scorers again. The four scored a combined 62 points.

Eaton scored all 16 points in the second half of the game as well as five out of eight assists.

Texas State recap

On Jan. 22 the team took on Texas State. Omier earned his 7th double-double with 23 points and 13 rebounds. He was the top scorer in the game.

The other top scorers included Sills with 21 points, Eaton with 11 points and Avery Felts with 5.

The team will take on Appalachian State Thursday at an away game at 5:30 p.m. You can stream the game on ESPN+.

Baseball returns in February

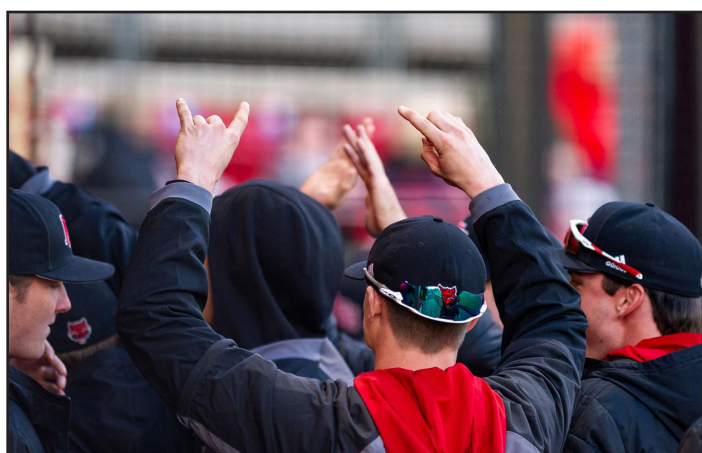

Season tickets for the team are now officially on sale. Former ticket holders can renew by phone or online. Ticket renewal must be done by the deadline Monday, Feb. 14.

On Tuesday the Red Wolves announced the 2022 signing class. 7 out of 8 new players are from Arkansas. The class includes Grayson Becker, Cason Campbell, Tanner Duncan, Ethan Fender, Grant Fitch, Clark Jenkins and Cross Jumper.

"This class of new Red Wolves brings significant leadership traits and well-rounded athleticism to the diamond," Head coach Tommy Raffo said. "Five position players, two pitchers and one dual-position player are from all over Arkansas and the bootheel of Missouri. Several are successful multi-sport athletes at their high schools and are very coachable, having played in a variety of environments. We are excited for their potential and future for Arkansas State Baseball."

The baseball team will compete in their first game against Samford at Birmingham Alabama Feb 18 at 4 p.m.

During her 2020-2021 season at Auburn, Patton played in 16 games and started eight times.

The team will continue on and return to action in a home game against UT Arlington at 7 p.m. The game will be streamed on ESPN+ as well as radio broadcasted on 95.3 The Ticket.

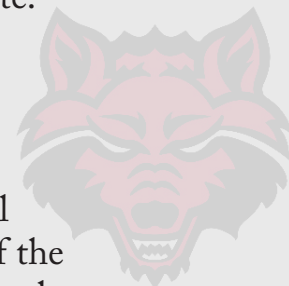
