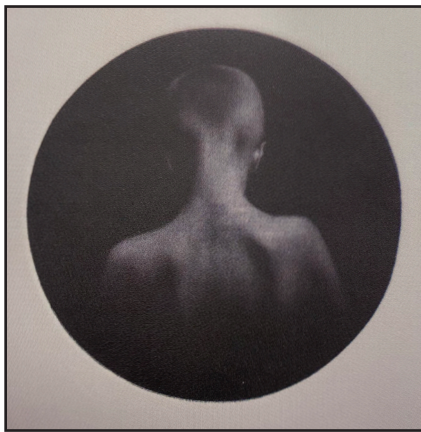

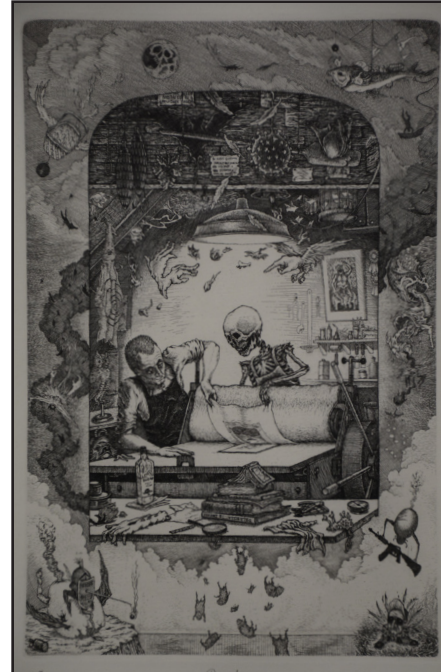
The piece "Old School" by Jody Bruns, created in 2020.

BAM Staff Merit Award, "Then IV" created by Cleo Wilkinson.



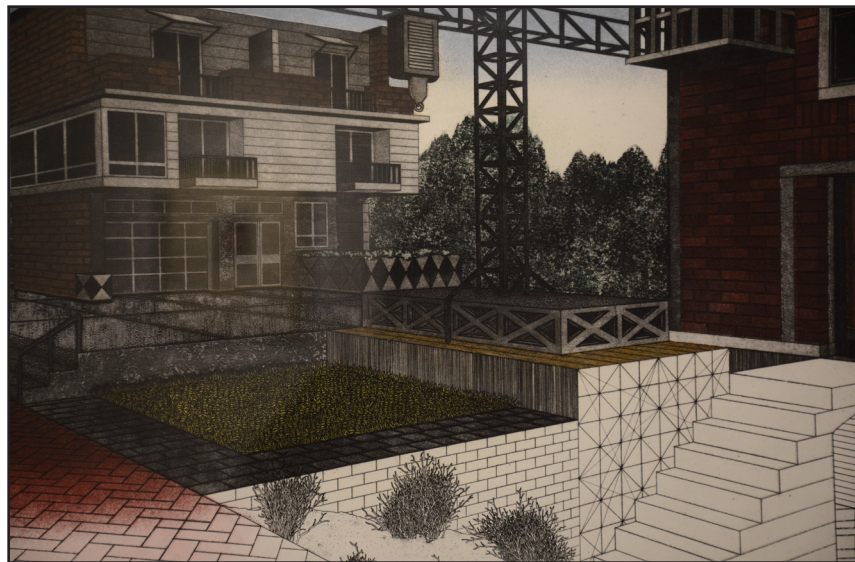
"Death and the Printmaker" by David Avery. DNSPE was founded to be a resource for printmaking students and has become one of America's best print contests.



Linda Whitney's mezzotint print, "Pinaskwi - Butterfly Dancer" included in the DNSPE.



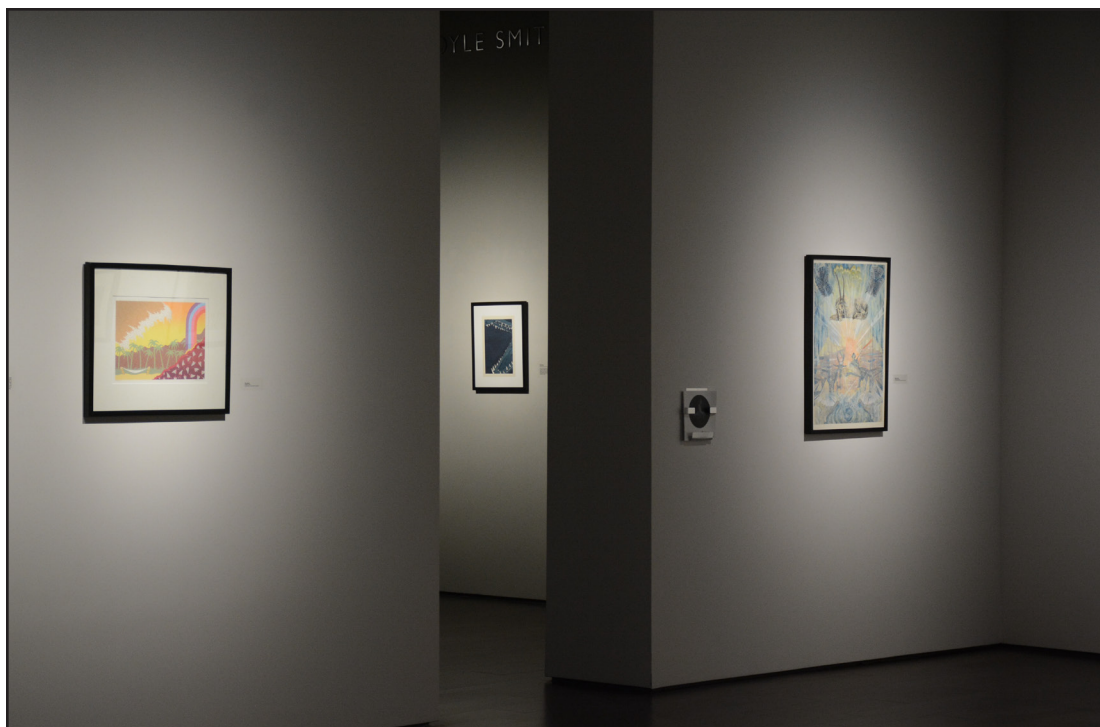
Carol Moore's hand colored lithograph, "The Everything Tree."
